To celebrate 100ths day we want our students to have some fun and dress up!


You can create a shirt that displays 100 items or dress up like you're 100 years old!



It is important that the school has the most up to date phone numbers for our students. If you have changed your phone number or the emergency contacts have changed, please notify the school of these changes.


