Every Monday we will have a smudge in the drum of the school to start the week and encourage students and staff to wear something of cultural importance to them such as braided hair, beaded items, culturally positive clothing, moccasins, etc.

We want our students to reclaim their cultural identity and we are looking forward to implementing any other cultural initiatives or ideas they have!

On Mi'kmaq Monday's we also will be using traditional foods on our menu (moose, fish, fiddleheads, berries etc.)

Looking for a hearty meal to cook for your family? Try this recipe.

MOOSE STEW

- 1 lb. moose stew meat, trimmed and cut into cubes
- 3 tbsp. oil
- 1 med. onion, chopped
- 1 (16 oz.) can stewed tomatoes
- 1 soup can water
- 1 tsp. paprika
- 1 clove garlic, crushed
- 4 med. potatoes, diced
- 6 med. carrots, sliced
- 1 can tomato soup 1 tsp. basil
- 1 tsp. pepper

Brown meat in hot oil. Place in crock pot. Add remaining ingredients and cook on low for 7 hours.

Paths® in our School

Solving problems is hard for children. Solving problems as a group is a skill that our students work on during PATHS® time. We learn to identify the problem and write it down. We talk about how we feel about the problem. Then, we brainstorm as many solutions to the problem as we can. We act out the best choices to see how they might work. Next, we choose the best solution and all agree to try it for a few days. We agree to come back and see if we have solved the problem or if it is still happening. If we still have a problem, we try these steps again. We keep trying to solve problems as a group, because we care about each other and work together to be a successful school! You can try this way to solve family problems too. Together is better!
